#### **Annual Fund Drive**

Trinity needs your participation in this year's Annual Fund Drive to help bridge the gap between the tuition parent's pay and what it actually costs to educate our area children. With the continual support of our parishes, parents, and the community, we will realize our goals.

Last year, we raised over 50,000.00! These donations provided tuition assistance to needy families, replaced bathroom sinks, helped purchase iPads for the kindergarten students. With the iPad purchase we can keep the 1:1 computer program in place with MacBook Pros available for the 3<sup>rd</sup> thru 6<sup>th</sup> grade and iPads for the K thru 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. The students learn many lifelong technology and work related skills with the iPads and laptops. Monies also supported the school budget to alleviate some of the burden from the supporting parishes, funded the parent alert system, alumni newsletter and Trinity in Touch parish newsletter, provided resources and professional development for teachers, and much more.

Our goal this year is for our Annual Fund Drive to continue to support our school. First and foremost, funds from the Annual Drive will again be used for tuition assistance for families that might otherwise be unable to send their child to Trinity, missing out on the strong Catholic education that we hold so dear. Secondly, it is used for academic advancement, providing for learning opportunities that might otherwise be unaffordable. Finally, the Annual Fund Drive allows for special building projects and other general operating expenses. We are also committed to helping the churches keep future subsidies at a reasonable level.

Mailings are being sent out on November 1st. If you do not receive a mailing, purple colored donor cards and brochures will be available in area churches. Thank you for your dedication to Trinity and a quality Catholic education for area youngsters.
